# JOYCEVILLE PUBLIC SCHOOL ADVISORY COUNCIL MEETING FEBRUARY 9, 2022 DRAFT

Welcome: A. Currie and M. Robertson welcomed everyone to the virtual meeting.

<u>Approval of Previous Minutes</u>: K. Greenlees made the motion to accept the minutes from the previous meeting held on 3 November 2021. The motion was seconded by R. Edwards. A vote was taken and the minutes were passed.

<u>Agenda:</u> M. Robertson asked for someone to make a motion to accept the agenda for this meeting as presented. C. Walker made the motion to accept the agenda. This was seconded by K. McPherson. A vote was taken and the agenda was accepted.

<u>Principals/Vice Principals Report:</u> Principals/Vice Principals report notes are attached for easy reference. J. Paquin thanked the council for all their support that they provide to the school.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u>: We currently have \$7654.82 in our account. We also have \$12547.70 in our bingo account. Everyone is reminded to share the notices on social media regarding bingo.

<u>Bingo Update:</u> M. Robertson and K. Greenlees advised that the bingo fundraiser would be a separate stand-alone committee. Any requests for money from this account can then be voted on separately from School Advisory meetings. D. Maillet voiced concerns about holding this as a separate committee and felt that it should still be under the umbrella of the School Council due to probably the same members will sit on both committees and this could all be done at our council meetings. It was agreed that whoever is interested in joining this committee is to email K. Greenlees or M. Robertson and let them know. Kim will update everyone on the dates that need to be covered at the bingo hall and also the training required at this time.

<u>Tents:</u> K. Beach inquired about a previous discussion about purchasing a new pop up tent for use at the school. After discussion, it was agreed that Kim Beach would look into purchasing a  $10 \times 10$  tent with sides for use at events. The total approved that can be spent will be \$500.00. A vote was taken and this was approved.

<u>Flex Fridays:</u> Discussion took place about holding Flex Fridays again this year. After discussion, it was agreed that M. MacDonald would consult with the teachers and provide a proposal on what is required for Flex Fridays and she will send the proposal out to all members.

<u>Hot Lunches:</u> Pizza and chicken fingers are being offered to staff and students for \$5.00 through Pisanos. This will be held on Wednesdays. Everyone was very happy to see the return of hot lunches.

<u>Grant for Community Involvement:</u> A. Currie and M. Robertson advised that we had been approved for \$1000.00 for a grant for community involvement. Each student will be making birdhouses out of popsicle sticks. Pictures will then be posted online for wildlife involvement.

<u>School Trips:</u> J. Paquin and E. Stephen advised that they are looking into the possibility of still having our school trips to Grass Creek Park. An option might be to have different classes go on different days due to COVID concerns. K. McPherson advised that she is hopeful that these trips can continue as they are enjoyed by all students especially the younger ones. More information will be provided as the nicer weather arrives.

<u>Insurance for Events:</u> J. Paquin will talk with the Board of Education to find out if insurance is required for such events as a movie night etc.

<u>Pittsburg Fund for Playground Equipment:</u> D. Maillet inquired as to the option previously discussed about trying to obtain money from the Pittsburg Fund for playground equipment. K. McPherson advised that the proposals must be submitted by January of each year. After discussion it was agreed that anyone who is interested in assisting with this project should contact K. McPherson. D. Maillet, M. MacDonald and R. Edwards volunteered to assist. K. McPherson will schedule a meeting to discuss this and what is required.

## Spirit Week & SAC
